

# *Harris Finds His Feet*by Catherine Rayner

### **Shadow Puppet Theatre**



#### You will need:

- A shoe box (or similar)
- Pencil
- Craft knife
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Baking paper
- Sellotape
- 2 wooden skewers
- Thin card
- 2 large paper clips
- A mobile phone with a torch

### What to do

- 1. Turn the box upside down and draw a border of 2cm around the base.
- 2. Ask an adult to cut along the lines, using the ruler and the craft knife. This will create a frame on the base of the box.
- 3. Attach double-sided tape around the inside of the frame.
- 4. Cut a rectangle of baking paper to the same size as the shoe box lid and stick it to the inside of the frame.

- 5. Open up the box, so the base becomes the front of the theatre and the lid becomes the base. Rest your phone against the lid.
- 6. Draw outlines of Harris and Grandad onto the thin card and cut them out. Attach each character to a skewer using the sellotape.
- 7. Switch on the torch and move your shadow puppets between the light source and the paper. You are now ready to perform your show!














### LANDSCAPE COLLAGE

Create a landscape collage based on one of the spreads in the book.

### You Will Need:

- Paints
- Plain paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- A pencil
- Paintbrush and sponge



#### What to Do

- 1. Choose which landscape you would like to recreate and mix the different shades for the picture.
- 2. Start by painting the sky onto a piece of paper. You only need to cover about a third of the paper, as the rest will later be covered by your collage. Use the brush and sponge to create different textures.
- 3. Next, paint the different colours you have mixed onto different pieces of paper.
- 4. Once these have dried, carefully tear pieces of paper to create the shapes of the mountains or hillsides.
- 5. Arrange the pieces of paper in layers beneath the sky. When you are happy with your arrangement, glue them on.
- 6. Finally, draw and paint Harris, cut out and place him in the picture.






### **Further Activities to Try**


1. Visit Catherine's website to colour in a picture of Harris and find out how to draw some of her other characters.



- 5. Retell the story of Harris' journey to independence by drawing a story map to show where Harris and his Grandad go and what they do.




